COLLEGE REGULATIONS

General:

- 1) Every student shall obtain on admission his/her Identity card from the Librarian.
The procedure for obtaining the identity card will be put up on the notice board. Every student shall submit to the Librarian 4 copies of his/her latest photograph of 1 ½" x 2" size, printed on glossy paper.
- 2) The student must always display the identity card with his/her photograph affixed there on and attested before entering the college premise. No student shall be allowed to attend practical classes, etc. unless he/she displays his/her Identity Card.
- 3) Students shall attend lectures, practicals, tutorials and seminars according to the regular Time-Table on all working days of the college. **Students shall not remain absent from lectures, practicals, tutorials, seminars and examinations without prior permission of the Principal.** Absence without prior leave may lead to loss of term, since to keep a term, a student has to complete, to the satisfaction of the Principal, the course of study prescribed for the term of the class to which he/she belongs.
- 4) **Students are warned that, if their attendance at lectures, practicals, tutorials and seminars is unsatisfactory, their names will not be retained on the College Rolls with effect from the beginning of the Second Term of the academic year.**
- 5) In case of illness, a student shall apply for leave by post as soon as possible with a doctor's certificate attached with the application and shall report himself /herself to the Principal immediately after resuming attendance.
- 6) In case of Science students the term of terms shall not be deemed as kept and shall not be granted unless the student produces at the end of the term his/her laboratory journal in his/her Science subjects duly signed by respective Heads of Science departments and wherever Tutorials are prescribed, a certificate each from the respective Heads of Departments stating that the student has completed the Tutorial course in the concerned subject.
- 7) Students of Science classes are required to wear aprons (white) while working in the Chemistry, Botany, Zoology and Microbiology laboratories.
- 8) **Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in the College Campus.**
- 9) In the case of Arts and Commerce students, the term or terms shall not be deemed as kept and shall not be granted unless the student produces at the end of the term, a certificate each from the Heads of respective Departments stating that the student has completed the prescribed tutorial/Practical work.
- 10) Students shall not attend classes other than their own without the permission of the Principal.
- 11) Conduct of students in the classes as well as on the premises of the college shall be such as will cause no disturbance to the fellow-students or to other classes.

- 12) Students shall not loiter in the college premises during Lecture/Practical hours.**
- 13) Smoking in the college premises is strictly prohibited.**
- 14) Students shall do nothing either inside or outside the college that will in any way interfere with orderly administration and discipline.
- 15) No society or association shall be formed in the college and no person invited to address a meeting without the Principal's permission.
- 16) No student shall collect any money as contribution for picnic, trip, educational visits, get-together, study-notes, charity or any other activity without the prior sanction of the Principal.
- 17) In the college debates and at other meetings, the chair shall be taken by a responsible person approved by the Principal and the subject of debates shall have the previous approval of the Principal.
- 18) No student shall be allowed to take active part in current politics.
- 19) No student shall communicate any information or write to the Press about matters dealing with the college administration.
- 20) Students are expected to take proper care of the college property and to help in keeping the premises neat and tidy. Causing damage to the property of the college, e.g. defacing walls and doors, damaging fittings or breaking furniture, etc. is a breach of discipline and will be duly punished.
- 21) Students should not leave behind their books, valuables and other belongings when they go out of the laboratories/common rooms/class rooms.
- 22) The college is not responsible for lost property. Students should deposit lost property found by them at the Library counter. The owner should claim it at the Library counter on the following day.
- 23) Vehicles (2-wheeler) brought by the students will be parked at the owners' risk, in the place provided for parking. The college is not responsible for the theft of vehicles or any damage to them.
- 24) Students applying for certificates, testimonials etc. and those requiring the Principal's signature on any kind of document or application should first contact the Registrar of the college. No paper should be brought by students directly to the Principal for his/her signature.
- 25) If, for any reason, the continuance of a student in the college is, in the opinion of the Principal, detrimental to the best interests of the college, the Principal may ask such a student to leave the college without giving any reasons.
- 26) Students joining the college are expected to accept and observe all the Rules and Regulations of the college to the best satisfaction of the Principal.
- 27) Matters not covered by the existing rules shall rest at the discretion of the Principal.

INTRODUCTION OF NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY (NEP 2020)

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) is a comprehensive framework for the transformation of the education system in India. It was introduced by the Government of India in July 2020 and aims to bring about significant reforms in the country's educational landscape. The NEP 2020 is the first major education policy in India in over three decades, replacing the previous policy which was formulated in 1986. It seeks to address the evolving needs of 21st century learners and align the education system with global standards. The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) introduces significant reforms in the higher education sector in India. It aims to transform the higher education landscape by addressing various aspects such as curriculum, pedagogy, governance, and research.

Highlights of NEP–2020:

- 1. Multidisciplinary Approach:** NEP 2020 emphasizes a multidisciplinary approach in higher education, allowing students to choose subjects from different disciplines and promoting the integration of arts, humanities, sciences, and professional courses. It aims to break the rigid boundaries between different fields of study and encourage cross- disciplinary learning.
- 2. Flexible Undergraduate Programs:** The policy introduces flexible undergraduate programs, allowing students to choose a major and minor subject combination or to pursue a multidisciplinary approach with a wide range of subjects. This flexibility enables students to customize their education based on their interests and career goals.
- 3. Holistic Learning and Skill Development:** NEP 2020 emphasizes holistic learning and the development of critical thinking, creativity, communication skills, and ethical values among students. It focuses on promoting experiential learning, vocational education, and internships to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical skills.
- 4. Research and Innovation:** The policy lays emphasis on promoting research and innovation in higher education institutions. It encourages the establishment of research parks, incubation centers, and collaboration with industries and research organizations to foster a culture of innovation and entrepreneurship. NEP 2020 also emphasizes the integration of research into undergraduate education.
- 5. Accreditation and Quality Assurance:** The policy emphasizes the need for a robust accreditation and quality assurance system in higher education. It aims to establish an independent and autonomous accreditation authority to ensure the maintenance of high- quality standards in higher education institutions.
- 6. Technology Integration:** NEP 2020 recognizes the importance of technology in higher education and encourages the integration of technology-enabled learning methods.

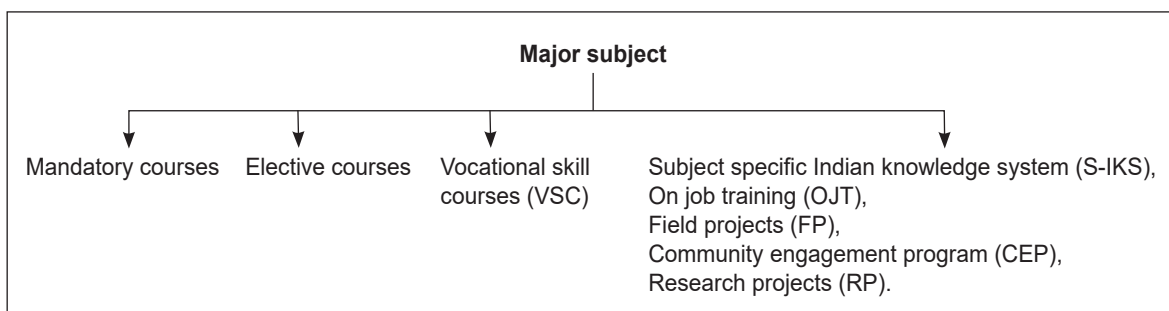
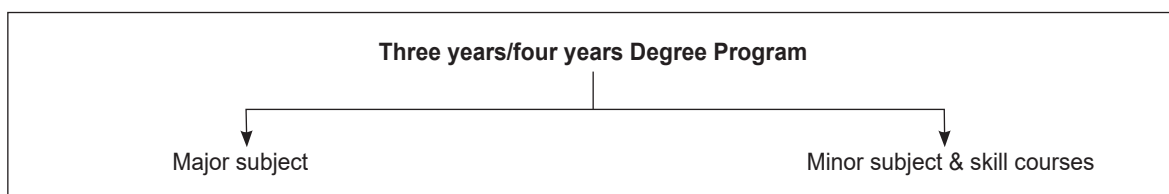
It promotes the use of online resources, digital libraries, and e-learning platforms to enhance access to education and improve the quality of teaching and learning.

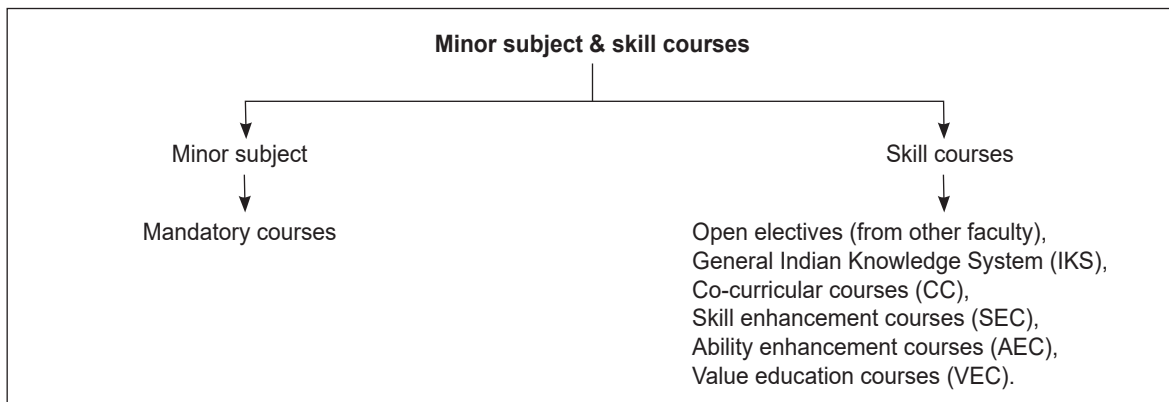
- 7. **International Collaboration:** The policy encourages higher education institutions to foster international collaborations and partnerships. It aims to facilitate student and faculty exchange programs, joint research projects, and twinning programs with reputed foreign universities to promote global exposure and enhance the quality of education.
- 8. **Governance and Regulation:** NEP 2020 proposes the establishment of a single, overarching higher education regulatory authority called the Higher Education Commission of India (HECI). HECI will replace existing regulatory bodies and ensure a more streamlined and transparent regulatory framework for higher education institutions.

The National Education Policy 2020 in higher education envisions a transformation in the quality, relevance, and accessibility of higher education in India. It aims to equip students with the necessary skills and knowledge to excel in a rapidly changing global landscape and contribute effectively to society and the economy. The structure of the Three/Four-year bachelor’s degree program under NEP-2020 allows the learner to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen Major and Minors as per their choices and the feasibility of exploring learning in different institutions.

For the **Department/Subject Specific Core courses (DSCs)**, during the admission process, learners need to choose a single Major subject from the list of subjects offered by a college. The DSC approach ensures intensive specializations in the Multidisciplinary domain. In a three year or four- year degree program, a learner has to learn the following:

- 1. Major subject
- 2. Minor subject and Skill courses (as shown below)

The National Education Policy (NEP-2020) advocates an interdisciplinary approach allowing learners to have Major-Minor subject combinations that cater to the demand of time. An interdisciplinary framework that bridges the gap between the social and life sciences. Bachelor of Arts degree with Psychology as Major subject and Zoology as Minor subject integrating Psychology with Zoology offers a distinctive edge in modern academia and career paths.

- Interdisciplinary Perspective: Students gain a competitive edge in understanding the complex interaction between mental processes and physiological systems.
- Scientific Rigor: Develop a strong foundation in laboratory sciences and analytical thinking that complements psychological theory.
- Practical Edge: Understanding physiology and immunology is crucial for careers in clinical psychology and rehabilitation.
- Holistic Learning: Move beyond social theory to understand behavior as a complex biological reality.
- Zoology: The Biological Blueprint of Life: Choosing Zoology as a minor provides Psychology students with a robust scientific foundation. Understanding the physiological and evolutionary aspects of life is essential for a holistic view of behavioral sciences.

VERTICALS IN NEP-2020

During a graduation tenure, a learner will have to learn various categories of subjects like Major subject courses, Elective subject courses, Minor subject-related courses, Generic or Open Electives (OE), Vocational Skill Courses (VSC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Value Education Courses (VEC), Indian Knowledge System (IKS), On the Job Training (OJT), Field Projects (FP), Community Engagement Program (CEP), Co-Curricular Courses (CC), Research Projects (RP).

1. **Major subject** is a subject of specialization in which a learner gets the degree (e.g. B.Sc. Major in Zoology). Each Major subject will have a number of courses.
2. **Elective courses** are related to the Major subject offered in the third year of graduation. They are called Electives because a learner gets to choose the course from a list of offered courses. For example, in semester V of B.Sc., Zoology may be offering subjects like 1. Medical Diagnostics 2. Tools and techniques in Biology. Out of these 2 elective courses, the learner can elect (choose) any one course.
3. **Minor subject** is one which compliments the learning of a Major subject. For example, a learner with a Zoology Major may have Botany or Chemistry as Minor subjects. In the second semester, a learner has to choose the Minor subject from the list of Major-Minor combinations offered by college.
4. **Generic or Open Electives (OEs)** Each faculty will be offering a basket (list of) courses for OE. A learner has to choose OE courses from other faculty i.e. a learner of B.Sc. may choose OE from Arts faculty or Commerce faculty.
5. **Vocational Skill Courses (VSC)** are offered by each Major subject. The objective of learning VSC is to enable learners to develop job or business-oriented skills related to the Major subjects.
6. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** are general in nature. The SEC enhances the employability of the learner by enhancing their job-related skills like presentation skills, use of advanced level of software etc. A learner has to choose SEC from the basket (list of) courses offered by the college.
7. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)** offers a basket of courses related to Languages and Communication Skills, Environmental Science and Sustainable Development.
8. **Value Education Courses (VEC)** encompasses courses related to personality building, embedding ethical, cultural and constitutional values, promoting critical thinking and scientific temperament etc. A learner has to choose VEC from the basket of VEC offered by the college.

9. **Indian Knowledge System (IKS)** courses are of two categories (general IKS and Major subject specific S-IKS). The objective of having IKS courses is to give information regarding the contribution made by Indians in the various fields. As a result, a learner would get inspiration from it. A learner has to learn general IKS in the first semester and a Major subject- specific IKS in the fifth semester.
10. **On-Job Training (OJT)** involves internship and apprenticeship related to the Major subject. The objective of having OJT is to link the subject-based learning with skill requirements in the industry. The best possible way to achieve this is to expose learners to the actual field of work by offering them an internship and apprenticeship. Each Major subject offers OJT courses in the third year of graduation.
11. **Field Projects (FP) and Community Engagement Program (CEP)** courses are offered by each Major subject and their objective is to field based learning, rural-urban settings, socio-economic context of the subject etc.
12. **Co-curricular Courses (CC)** such as Sports, Culture and NSS/NCC. A learner may enroll for these courses and avail the credits.

NEP CREDIT STRUCTURES FOR UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

I. FACULTY OF ARTS – First-Year DSC Model Courses offered under NEP-2020

Major/Minor Courses: Ancient Indian Culture, Defense Studies, Economics, Education, English Literature, Geography, Hindi, History, Marathi, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sanskrit, Sociology. Students have the option to choose a Major (Core) from any of the Fourteen subjects.

Combination of Major Courses: Students can customize their academic path by selecting two options for Major/Minor out of the 14 Courses that align with their interests and goals. One of these will become Major and other remains as Minor in the second year.

(a) **Scheme of Examinations (For F.Y., S.Y., T.Y., P.G. part-I, P.G. part-II)-**

The performance of the learners will be evaluated in two components.

- The first component will be the Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) carrying 40% marks conducted by the Head of the Department.
- The second component will be the semester-wise Semester End Examination (SEE) carrying 60% marks conducted by the Controller of Examinations.

- a. The CIA assessment shall be conducted for a minimum total of 40 marks in a continuous manner. It must comprise minimum four components, out of which minimum two shall be LMS based. The final CIA marksheet shall reflect the conversion of 40 marks to 20 marks.
- b. The Semester End Examination (SEE) shall be of one hour duration.
2. The marking scheme for two-credit UG skill-based courses-Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) and Co-curricular Activities (CC)-is revised to a total of **50 marks under a single head of passing of External component**.
3. The marking scheme for all UG theory and practical components of Major, Minor, Elective, Major-linked Indian Knowledge System (IKS), Vocational Skill Course (VSC), Field Project (FP), On-the-Job Training (OJT), and Community Engagement Program (CEP) courses shall **remain unchanged**.
4. There is no change in the marking scheme for undergraduate courses carrying three or more credits.
5. The **Written Assignment component** of Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) for all undergraduate UG and PG programmes shall be replaced with a suitable alternative(s), as per the requirements of the respective subject through BOS..
6. All the above changes shall **be implemented progressively with effect from the academic year 2026-27 and shall apply to all relevant Regular and ATKT students**.

(c) Practical Courses-

Continuous internal assessment shall not be applicable for practical courses. Semester End Practical Examination for each practical course is conducted at the end of semester as per the direction given in the syllabus of the respective Board of Studies.

(d) The total credits to be earned by the student to achieve Under-Graduate Program Degree and Post-Graduate Program Degree shall be as follows:

6. **Standard of Passing-**

The standard of passing, rules of disqualification, rules of grace marks and benefit of A.T.K.T. will be as prescribed by the Examination Policy of Sathaye College (Autonomous).

Passing Standard- To pass the course, learners shall have to obtain a minimum 40% in CIA and SEE separately for each course.

For the Science stream, theory examination & practical examination shall remain separate heads of passing.

1. **Revised Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rules for the existing learners**

(To be added in the Examination Policy under point 9.1. Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rule)

- A). A learner is allowed to take admission in Semester VII (UG Hon./ UG Hon. with Research/PG part I) only if he/she has passed all courses of Semester I to VI in UG.
- B). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VIII, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in Semester-VII.

The result of Semester-VIII will not be declared until that learner has cleared all courses from Semester-VII.

2. **Revised Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rules for learners admitted to First Year UG from the academic year 2026–27 and onwards.**

(To be added in the Examination Policy under point 9.2. Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rule)

- A). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in Semester I.
- B). A learner may continue to Semester III even if they have failed in up to three courses in each of the Semesters I and II.
- C). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-IV, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in Semester-III
- D). A learner may continue to Semester V even if they have failed in up to three courses in each of the Semesters I, II, III and IV.
- E). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VI, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in Semester-V.

The result of Semester-VI will not be declared until the learner has cleared all courses from Semester-I to V

- F). A learner is allowed to take admission in Semester VII (UG Hon./ UG Hon. with Research/PG part I) only if he/she has passed all courses of Semester I to VI in UG.
- G). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-VIII, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in the Semester-VII.

The result of Semester-VIII will not be declared until the learner has cleared all courses from Semester-VII.

3. Revised Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rules for learners admitted to First Year PG from the academic year 2026–27 and onwards.

(To be added in the Examination Policy under point 9.3. Allowed to Keep Terms (ATKT) rule)

- A). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester II, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in Semester I.
- B). A learner may continue to Semester III even if they have failed in up to three courses in each of the Semesters I and II.
- C). A learner shall be allowed to keep term for Semester-IV, irrespective of the number of heads of failure in Semester-III

The result of Semester-IV will not be declared until the learner has cleared all courses from Semester-I, II, III.

4. Grade improvement under NEP-2020: w.e.f. 2026-2027

1. A learner may apply for grade improvement within two academic years from the date of successfully passing all Semesters of the degree programme (UG/PG).
2. A written application, along with the prescribed documents, shall be submitted to the Chief Controller of Examinations or Controller of Examinations. All applications shall be subject to scrutiny and approval by the Examination Section of the College.
3. At the time of application, the learner shall submit the original mark sheets of the selected Semesters.
4. The prescribed examination fee for grade improvement shall be payable as per the fee structure applicable in the academic year in which the application is submitted.
5. A learner may opt for grade improvement in a maximum of two Semesters and shall appear for the selected Semesters along with the regular/ATKT examination schedule by the College. No separate examination shall be conducted for grade improvement.

6. Grade improvement may be availed only once for a degree programme.
7. The learner shall appear for the grade improvement examination as per the syllabus and examination scheme previously passed by him/her.
8. The following NEP-2020 verticals; Co-Curricular Course (CC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Generic Indian Knowledge System (IKS), On-Job Training (OJT), Field Project (FP), Community Engagement Programme (CEP), Internship (IP), Research Project (RP).—shall not be eligible for grade improvement. The marks obtained in these components shall be carried forward. The learner shall appear for all other courses and passing heads of the selected Semesters, excluding the above-mentioned verticals.
9. The marks obtained in the grade improvement attempt shall be compared with the earlier marks, higher marks will be selected for the grade improvement calculation.
10. In case of failure or absence in any course during the grade improvement attempt, the earlier passing marks shall be retained.
11. The revised marks obtained through grade improvement shall be considered for the computation of CGPA and final award of class.
12. If a learner remains absent for the grade improvement examination, the attempt shall be treated as availed, and no further opportunity shall be granted.
13. A revised mark sheet/transcript indicating “Grade Improvement” shall be issued to the learner, irrespective of the outcome.
14. The decision of the College in all matters related to grade improvement shall be final and binding.

REFUND OF FEES: (Aided & Unaided Courses)

1. Rules in respect of refund of fees as per University of Mumbai Circular No. UG/412 of 2008 dt. 11th September 2008.

0.2859: Refund of Tuition, Development and all other fees after cancellation of admissions: The candidates who have taken admission in undergraduate courses in Govt. colleges, in Govt. aided and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges, and recognized Institutions may request for refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course. The refund of fees as applicable shall be made on or before 30th day after the date of cancellation and thereafter. The percentage of fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

NOTE: The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of academic term of the courses includes the following: -

- i) All the fee items chargeable for one year are as per relevant University circulars for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
- ii) The Fee charged towards group insurance and all fee components to be paid as University share (including Vice-Chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster, management fund, exam fee and Enrollment fee) are non-refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
- iii) Fee collected for Identity Card and Library Card, Admission Form and Prospectus, Enrollment and any other course specific fee **are not refundable** after the commencement of the academic term.

- iv) All refundable deposits (Laboratory, Caution Money and Library etc.) shall be fully returned at the time of cancellation.
2. All cases which do not fall under point 1 above shall be within the discretion of the Principal.

If the last day for submission of application for the refund of fees falls on Sunday or a public holiday, the next day shall be deemed to be the last day for the purpose.

3. Identity Card and the Reader's Tickets, if issued, and the Fee Receipt shall be surrendered along with the application for discontinuation and refund of fees.
4. **Collect the cancellation fees on or before 30th Sept. 2026 on any college working day, between 10 am and 12 noon.**

0.119 : Attendance :

The following shall be the minimum attendance necessary for keeping terms.

Faculty of Arts/Sc./Com.: Three-Fourths of the number of days on which lectures are delivered in each term.

(N.B.: A day's attendance means attendance at all the lectures, tutorials, seminars and practical's according to the regular class time-table for the day.)

0.125: To keep terms, an undergraduate must complete, to the satisfaction of the Principal, the course of study at the college prescribed for such terms for the class to which the undergraduate then belongs.

Students who fail to satisfy the conditions laid down by 0.119 and 0.125 will not be permitted to appear at the examinations.

2. Income Certificate from Tahsildar
3. Student Domicile Certificate from Tahsildar
4. For OBC/ VJNT/ SBC students Non Creamy Layer Certificate is required
5. Aadhaar Card

In case these documents are NOT submitted in due course, they are liable to pay balance fees. Students who are interested in availing of Fee concession should fill up the Scholarship/ Freeship form. (Vide circular from special Dist. Officer of Social Welfare, Mumbai Region Circular No. VGS/ KA/MUM/UP/BH/07-08 dated 23.06.2007)

ABOUT THE LIBRARY

Sathaye College Autonomous Library aims to facilitate a better understanding of the core subjects prescribed in the Sathaye College Autonomous syllabus, while also promoting awareness and sensitivity towards current societal issues. The library houses a rich and diverse collection of resources supporting a wide range of academic programmes, including B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., M.Sc. (Chemistry), M.Sc. (Botany), B.M.S., B.M.M., B.Sc. (I.T.), M.Sc. (Data Science), M.A. (Hindi), M.A. (History), and M.A. (Buddhist Studies).

The library collection comprises approximately 79000+ books covering various disciplines, along with 48 magazines and journals. It also includes around 1,010 CD-ROMs, 7,106 exclusive reference books, 10 daily newspapers, and a substantial number of bound volumes of journals.

The library receives various pamphlets and books having information about **Personality development** and Career Building .A separate collection has been created to preserve these books. The students are advised to browse through the pamphlets, internet sites, books etc. for getting a clear perspective about a particular career and development of interest in desired areas.

Borrowing Rights

- The Useful instructions for Library services are printed on the rear side of the Library Identity Card, for your ready reference.
- “The Special Privilege Cards OR Reading Club Card” for reading are available to the Bonafide Students of this college as per the recommendations by Departmental Teachers and scrutiny of the Reading Room Statistics in the library. The journals and magazines are issued to students in the Reading Hall for spot reading only. They should not lend the magazines and journals out of the library (except paid memberships via Special Reading Club Card).
- Sending reminders for the books is not obligatory for the library.
- No reader should take a book or any material out of the library without having it properly issued to him or her.
- Books drawn on lost cards will continue to be the responsibility of the borrower (in whose name the card was issued). Hence it is the sole responsibility of the students to inform the library immediately to mark the card in the system.
- For refund of Caution Money, Students must submit their set of library tickets along with the application to the Library.
- The regular students are requested to retain their library cards till the renewal of the membership next year.
- Books returned late during examination period will call for a heavy fine.

Other Services for Library Users

Code of Conduct for Students

- Students must display their I Cards prominently while entering the reading hall. They are required to show their I Cards for attendance registration at the counter to the library staff.
- Use of cell phones, laptops in the reading hall is restricted to limited Zones.
- Writing or making any kind of mark in a book or periodical is forbidden.
- Cutting or tearing of any photo or page from any publication is prohibited.
- Kindly observe the social discipline in the library hall and adhere strictly to its rules and regulations.
- Smoking or Eating is prohibited in the library Readers are not allowed to take their baggage inside the stack area except small notebook and pen.
- It is the responsibility of every borrower to keep the borrower tickets in their custody.
- If these are lost, the same should be reported immediately to the Principal. Duplicate borrower tickets can be obtained on payment of ₹ 100/-.
- All readers are required to observe discipline in the library. Kindly behave with the library counter staff politely in order to get good and quick service from them.
- Students are advised to read the notices from time to time, put-up on the Notice- board for important announcements and Notifications of the college. Kindly visit the website of the college for upcoming events and notices.

Current Reading Section:

- Reference Books (Encyclopedia, Directory, Handbook, Dictionary, Atlas) shall not be taken out of the library.
- Every reader using the reference section of the library shall return the book(s) consulted to the staff at the reference counter before leaving the library.
- Counter Staff of the library will assist the readers in locating the relevant information and/or sources on the said subject of their study and interest through OPAC. The students are required to log in at OPAC on the quick link and submit the requirement in search windows.

- If a reader has not finished reading any book of spot consultation and still wants to continue with the book for the next day he may be allowed for an overnight issue of the said book on producing the relevant demand card kept at the counter.
- Photocopying of entire books is prohibited as per the Copyright Acts. If a reader wishes to photocopy certain portions or pages of a book, he should apply for the photocopy facility in the relevant Performa and make the payment for the same at the rate Re 1/- per page at counters in the Reading Hall.
- The library reserves the right to refuse a copying order if, in its judgment, fulfillment of the order would involve violation of Indian Copyright Act, 1957, which governs the making of photocopies or other reproductions of copyright material.
- Question paper sets and Syllabus files are available on special request for referring in the Reading Hall only.

Cost for Damaged Books or Periodicals

- Books written in, underlined, mutilated, damaged or lost by the Readers, must be paid for at a rate determined by the library.
- If any book or periodical is damaged or lost by the borrower he/she will either replace it by another copy or pay the current cost with the handling charges additional to the cost. The copy has to be replaced by way of a new one of the same or later edition.

The price of a rare/out of print book will be determined by the authorities and it should be paid by the borrower responsible for the damage or loss of the book/periodical.

- When a single volume from a multi-volume set is lost or damaged the specific price of the whole set will be charged, unless and otherwise the said volume of the set lost can be obtained separately. In this case the cost of the particular volume alone will be recovered.

Online Public Access Catalogue (i- OPAC)

The Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) provides members with a listing of all material available in the library. The OPAC can be searched by author, title, subject, call number, key word and several other options. In addition to identifying the availability of a book in the library, the OPAC also indicates whether the book is presently available or checked out. Library staff assist in using OPAC effectively and locating the title you desire. The reservation facilities can be availed at the web OPAC.

Facilities for Computing: Network Resource Center (NRC) is the Computing Facility available

Through OPAC, users can:

- Search books and other materials by title, author, subject, keyword, ISBN, etc.
- Check the availability status of items
- View call numbers, location details, and bibliographic information Access information about new arrivals and library holdings

OPAC enhances user convenience by providing 24/7 access to the library catalogue and improves the efficiency of library services.

ABOUT RESEARCH

Research/CRF/DBT/Research Fledgling

- **Research Centre**

Education and research are intrinsically linked, each enhancing the other. A research-oriented approach to teaching and learning enables higher education institutions to achieve global competency. Research not only keeps faculty updated but also makes the learning process more engaging and application-driven for students.

Recognizing the significance of a strong research culture, the Research Committee has introduced two flagship programs to foster academic inquiry and innovation within the college:

The Fledgling Researchers Programme – This initiative encourages students to explore new research ideas under the mentorship of experienced research advisors. It aims to cultivate a new generation of skilled researchers who contribute meaningfully to their respective fields.

Institutional Research Grant- The college has the facility of funding the research proposals of Faculty members and students. Under this scheme a provision of grant of upto Rs 50,000/- per project for faculty members and upto Rs 20,000/- per project for student has been made.

Total 10 faculty members and 7 group of UG, PG students have availed this facility.

To further support research endeavours, the college established the Central Research and Instrumentation Laboratory in 2022. This facility provides essential scientific instruments and advanced software to support research across disciplines, including Science, Languages, Commerce, and Humanities.

Research Contribution by Faculty Members:

Out of 51 full-time & 74 CHB faculty members, one holds a D. Litt. 35 have Ph.D. degrees, and 10 are currently pursuing doctoral studies. Over the past five years, faculty members have published 256 research papers in national and international journals, 65 books, and 09 book chapters. The college has received a research grant of ₹.40,46,970/- and 15 research projects have been successfully completed by faculty members.

- **Central Research Facility**

In pursuit of academic excellence and strengthening the research wing, we at Sathaye College (Autonomous) have developed a Central Research Facility with the support of the Parle Tilak Vidyalaya Association. The facility is open to all students and staff of the college to pursue scientific research. The Central Research Facility also conducts training programs for training the staff and students of the college. The Inaugural function of the Central Research Facility at Sathaye College (Autonomous) was held on 2nd August 2022.

- **DBT Star College Scheme**

Department of Biotechnology (DBT) is committed to the values of i) Pursuit of excellence ii) Academic and intellectual freedom iii) Creativity and innovation iv) Diversity v) Cooperation and Communication & vi) accountability.

The Star College Programme was initiated by DBT in 2008 to support colleges and universities offering undergraduate education to improve science teaching across the country. This Programme was launched for improving critical thinking and encouraging 'hands on' experimental science at undergraduate level in basic science subjects. On a larger perspective, the programme was initiated envisioning that it shall encourage more students to take up higher education in science. Through this programme the Department identifies colleges with potential for excellence and provides support for developing infrastructure for academics and laboratory activities. This support is in turn expected to invigorate teaching and provide unique exposure of students to experimental science. Starting with a meagre 30 colleges in 2008, this pan India scheme has supported science departments in more than 300 colleges all over the country till date. Overall, it has been observed that the support received by colleges have resulted in a considerable decrease of student dropout rates in science subjects. Keeping in mind that this is the only programme implemented by the Department to support science education at the undergraduate level, the Star College Programme acts as a gateway and provides exposure to students about other schemes of the Department (and the GOI) to support higher education (post graduate level), graduate research (PhD), post-doctoral research, international exchange programmes, short term industry-oriented training courses in science. The Programme also acts as a catalyst in igniting young minds (faculty and students) to engage in networking, exposure visits to research institutes and industries and apply for research grants in order to prepare them for future challenges after the successful completion of their undergraduate courses. 162 undergraduate colleges across the country were ultimately supported under the Star College Programme during the last 5 years. Out of these, 45 colleges have been awarded Star College Status.

There are five participating departments in the DBT Star College Program, namely Botany, Chemistry, Physics, Microbiology and Zoology.

The College has received a total sanction of ₹ 64,26,000/- lakhs for capital assets and ₹ 90 lakhs for revenue thereby complying to a total of ₹ 1,54,26000/-.

Through these initiatives, Sathaye College continues to foster an environment of academic excellence, innovation, and intellectual growth. PTVA's Sathaye College (Autonomous) applied to DBT Star College Scheme in May 2022 was selected for support of the Scheme in October 2023. The Program has been initiated in the College from August 2024 for a tenure of 3 years till August 2027.

The Department of Chemistry has recently established a new research center aimed at advancing scientific innovation and discovery. The center is equipped with modern laboratories and state-of-the-art instruments to support cutting-edge research in various fields of chemistry. It provides students and faculty with valuable opportunities to engage in experimental work, develop new ideas, and collaborate on research projects. This initiative marks a significant step toward promoting academic excellence and contributing to scientific progress.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sathaye College (Autonomous) is an important quality monitoring committee of the college. It works to promote, sustain, and enhance the institution's overall academic and administrative standards. 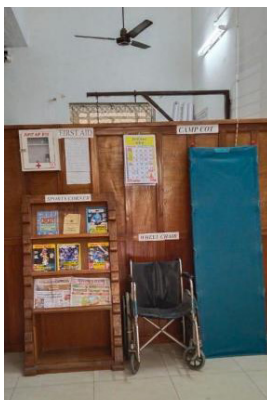

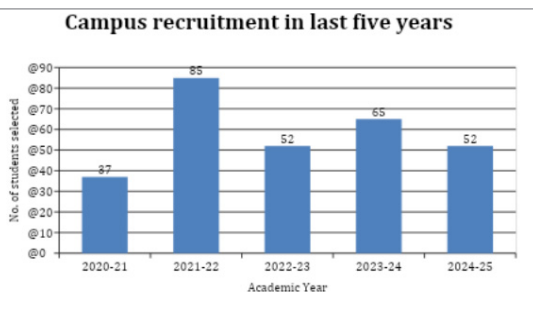

NATIONAL CADET CORPS UNIT (NCC UNIT)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) Unit of Sathaye College plays an important role in developing discipline, leadership, and a spirit of patriotism among students. The college has an active NCC unit consisting of 56 cadets in the 3 Maharashtra Battalion (Boys Division) and 52 cadets in the 8 Maharashtra Girls Battalion (Girls Division). The unit has achieved significant recognition and has been awarded the Vice Chancellor's Banner of the University of Mumbai three times, reflecting its excellence in training, performance, and participation in NCC activities. Through regular parades, training sessions, and camps, cadets are encouraged to build confidence, teamwork, and a strong sense of responsibility towards the nation. Students holding the 'C' Certificate can apply through the NCC Special Entry Scheme for officer-level positions in the armed forces, where no written examination is required and candidates directly appear for the SSB interview. NCC cadets also receive preference in recruitment under schemes such as Agniveer and Home Guards, and the leadership and discipline developed through NCC training are highly valued in the private sector, particularly for managerial and leadership positions. Thus, the NCC unit provides a strong platform for students to develop their personality and pursue rewarding career opportunities.



NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME UNIT (NSS UNIT)

National Service Scheme is a voluntary organization focused on community service. Its objectives include developing students' personalities, fostering social responsibility, and promoting citizenship. NSS mobilizes students for nation-building through various activities.
